Pavilion is delighted to announce the artists selected for its Commissions Programme 2008: Peter Ainsworth, Tess Hurrell, Jo Longhurst, Moira Lovell and Kevin Newark.

Pavilion will collaborate with each of the artists to produce a new body of work for exhibition at the National Media Museum, opening September 2008.

Peter Ainsworth is a recent MA Graduate from the London College of Communication and was a finalist for the London Photographic Awards in 2004.

Tess Hurrell is a BA Graduate from the University of Brighton. Tess was shortlisted for the ArtQuest residency in Berlin in 2007, and was a recipient of a merit award in the AOP Student Awards in 2006.

Jo Longhurst is a recent PhD Graduate from the Royal College of Art, London. Jo has had shows within the UK and abroad and has featured in a number of publications including; Portfolio Magazine and the Observer.

Moira Lovell is a recent MA Graduate from the London College of Communication and lecturer at the University of Suffolk. Moira was one of the Jerwood Photography Award winners in 2007 for the series *The After School Club*.

Kevin Newark is a recent MA Graduate from the London College of Communication and was one of the Jerwood Photography Award winners in 2007 for the series *Protoplasm*.

The exhibition in September will be complemented by a series of interpretive events and a publication, featuring the new work and accompanying critical texts.

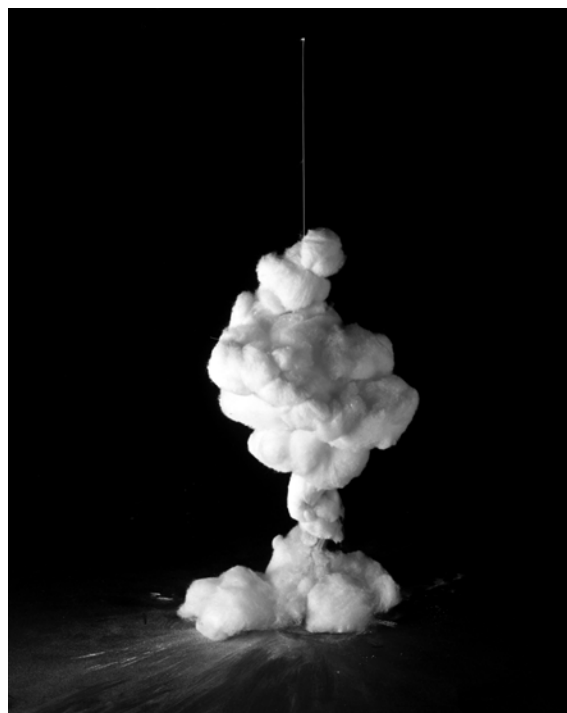
